Boon Wurrung Language

You may hear your children speak some of the Boon Wurrung language they have been learning at kinder. Elders Carolyn Briggs and Fay Stewart-Muir have given our kinder permission to use these words. Each month we will list a few of these words in our newsletter. This month, we have included the following:

Gurrun (gur-run) – Elbow Mirring – Eyes **Barring (bar-ring)** - Knees **Gaang** – Nose





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May recipe – Super easy no bake coconut and date balls (2 ingredients!!)

3 cups dessicated coconut

2 cups pitted dates

Place 2 cups of coconut and the dates in a food processor/or blender.

Process for 3-4 minutes scraping down the sides as needed.

Remove from the processor and roll teaspoon size balls in the remaining coconut.
